Railing Maintenance

Thanks to the army of volunteers who helped wash down the railings and road signs at Blacksmith's Corner. For future reference around 11 volunteers got the job done in under 2 ½ hours. The railings look noticeably better which I am sure many people will notice. Less obvious is the clearing of drain/ducts from the kerb to the ditch. These are now all clear and will aid drainage significantly.

On a negative note a member of the community has expressed their concern to Suffolk CC Highways Dept. that the debris we cleared from the kerbside is "hazardous waste" and should be "disposed of in a safe manner by suitable operatives". The member of the community has also drawn reference to us doing the same last year.
