Notice is hereby given that Drinkstone Parish Council has submitted a draft Neighbourhood Development Plan (the "Drinkstone Neighbourhood Plan") to Mid Suffolk District Council under Regulation 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended).

The 'Plan Proposal'

In accordance with Regulation 16, Mid Suffolk District Council will commence formal consultation on the draft Drinkstone Neighbourhood Plan on Monday 16 December 2019. Comments are invited on whether the 'plan proposal' as submitted (the draft Plan and supporting documentation) fulfils the Basic Conditions as required by Paragraph 8(1)(a)(2) of Schedule 4B to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (inserted by the Localism Act 2011).
